PRACTICE GAP

As the field of medicine is constantly changing with new science, new technology, and new devices which improve patient outcomes, physicians need awareness. The physicians attending this annual conference are from many different specialties and many specialists are not fully aware of developments in fields other than their own. The optimal screening and treatment strategies are not being used, leading to 'practice gaps'. This year we will focus on new advances in Cardiology (acute MI), Anesthesia and Radiology. A talk on metabolic syndrome for the primary care physician has been designed to bridge the perceived practice gap between current community management of this entity and improved, potentially achievable management, based on more recent knowledge. The importance of colon cancer screening will be discussed.

NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Topics were developed from previous evaluations, faculty perception, and participant requests. Suggestions were made to include topics that will help the primary care physician and not just specialists.

OBJECTIVES

1. Review Evidence-Based Medicine and how to use it.
2. Discuss new updates in the treatment of Gout
3. Review new treatment modalities in Acute Myocardial Infarction and Arrhythmias
4. Assess updates in Lung Cancer, Breast and Colon Cancer
5. Recognize Issues in Anesthesia for children

TARGET AUDIENCE

This program is intended for the physicians who are alumni of MAMCOAANA who belong to various specialties of medicine.

FORMAT

The program will consist of four-hour sessions for each day. There will be didactic lectures, followed by a discussion period.
