PRACTICE GAP

The field of medicine is constantly changing with new science, new technology, and new devices which improve patient outcomes- physicians need awareness. There are newer drugs and techniques being developed. The physicians attending this annual conference are from many different specialties and many specialists are not fully aware of developments in fields other than their own. The optimal screening and treatment strategies are not being used eg. Colon cancer screening, ideal managment of hypertension and subsequent kidney failure leading to 'practice gaps'. This year we will focus on recent advances in Cardiology, Nephrology, Anesthesia, and Rheumatology. There has been a spate of new imaging modalities in cardiology which the general internist may be unaware of – new imaging modalities in cardiology will be presented to cover this gap in our knowledge. There is a lack of awareness regarding hepatitis C and it's complications. A talk on Hepatitis C for the primary care physician has been designed to give an update regarding the epidemic and the complications of Hepatocellular carcinoma which physicians need to be aware of. Pain management, will be presented based on more recent knowledge along with discussion regarding alternative approaches. Thyroid disease is often missed and to address these thyroid problems will be discussed. Anesthesia in children has evolved and concerns about neurotoxicity will be addressed. Management of hypertension and chronic kidney disease are major issues in health care and a huge drain on our resources and newer therapies will be presented. The goal of this meeting is for the physician to apply new knowledge and strategies that will improve patient outcomes by discussing new trends and treatments in these topics selected.

NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Topics were developed from previous evaluations, faculty perception, and participant requests. Suggestions were made to include topics that will help the primary care physician and not just specialists.

TARGET AUDIENCE

This program is intended for the physicians who are alumni of MAMCOAANA who belong to various specialties of medicine including general medicine and family practice.

FORMAT

The program will consist of four-hour sessions for each day. There will be didactic lectures, followed by a discussion period.
